
Today's students are in school for 176 days every year which adds up to approximately 1000 hours depending on the division. Historically, school was focused on reading, writing, arithmetic and learning how to become efficient employees. School is a highly academic institution, but as the years go on, schools and the nature of education has changed. We as a school are now responsible for building well-rounded students and we as educators are tasked with providing more than just academics for our students. We are tasked with providing our students with a well rounded and diversified education. Building well-rounded students is now the commitment of all schools in all divisions in Alberta. We are still required to teach the core subjects (Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies) but it is not enough for our students to simply memorize facts. In today's education system, students must be able to apply basic facts to a variety of situations to hypothesize, extrapolate and use logic and reason. We are here to help build brains that have problem solving and critical thinking abilities that can be applied in a variety of real-world situations. Aside from the core subjects, schools provide students with an education in Health and Physical Education so that they are better able to lead healthy and active lives well past high school. The students also receive Fine Arts classes in the areas of Music, Drama and Art to provide them with a variety of different experiences to explore their interests and talents. We are tasked with providing our students opportunities to try new things and expand their knowledge base in a variety of subjects. Some of the opportunities we are able to provide our students come from outside our school walls.

We are fortunate to have amazing people, facilities and opportunities in and around our school and community. We have the use of great facilities and support from within our village and surrounding community. We have wonderful opportunities for our highschool students to complete some dual credit courses through Olds College and other Alberta community colleges. We have students who are working in and around the community as part of the Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) and Work Experience. We have many of our farming, ranching and acreage people who are assisting some of our students in completing their Green Certificate. Through these unique opportunities, our students receive high school credits, and for some, college credits as well, that go towards their high school diploma. We are thrilled that we are able to offer these, and many more, learning opportunities for our students. We continue to endeavour to enhance every student's education and provide each student with a well rounded background which can often open some doors to new ideas for futures outside our school walls.

Why It Matters

- Children who don't attend school regularly miss out on fundamental reading and math skills, and the chance to build a habit of good attendance that will carry them into college and careers.
- Children who are chronically absent in Kindergarten and Grade 1 are far less likely to read proficiently at the end of Grade 3 and beyond.

Make School Attendance a Priority

- Monitor your child's attendance and participation, and contact your teacher to address any concerns.
- Post your child's class schedule and log in information on the fridge or your child's homework area.
- Log in to Powerschool to receive updates about your child's grades (grades 5-12) and/or attendance.
- Find out if your child feels safe. If there are problems, contact the school team to find a solution.
- If your child seems bored or anxious about school, talk to their teacher, Family School Wellness, or other parents for advice on how to make your child feel safe and excited about learning.
- Ask for help when you need it. School staff, community agencies, or other parents are available to help families access supports when needed.
- **Contact your school team** if you need help to support your child and make school a great place to learn and grow.

Grade 12 Students and Parents: Many of our students have applied to Post-Secondary at this point and I encourage them to carefully watch the "deadlines." This could be for course selection, residence application, payment, or a "deferral" if the student decides not to attend. If the student has been "accepted" at a college or university, keep verifying that all documents have been sent. Please come and see me if you have any questions. The students will receive the Rutherford scholarship if 5 of their subjects average 75% or higher and they are attending post-secondary. Students apply for this scholarship in the Spring when they have been accepted at a post-secondary. I have distributed a scholarship book to the Grade 12s, please come and see me if you didn't receive it. Finally, I will be running scholarship application sessions during Tuesdays and Thursdays Guided Learning block for the month of February.

Grade 9 Students and Parents: Remember Grade 9s, your average in your classes will determine your placement in High School. Keep those grades high and you will have more post-secondary and career opportunities available to you. Our Career Class finished in January, thanks again to all of our guest speakers!

Grade 10 & 11 Students and Parents: Individual interviews, where we discuss course selection, high school credits, and future aspirations, will continue throughout the month of February. Remember to keep your marks up, especially those who are planning to attend university next year, as they are now accepting students based on their grade 11 results.




LEGO CLUB; FEB 15- MAR15
