Grade 9 Info Night:

Wednesday, April 24th at 7:00pm will be our annual Grade 9 parent and student meeting in the library. Teachers will explain their high school classes and will hand out the recommendations for high school levels of courses. If you have any questions, please feel free to call me!

Grade 10 Students: Individual student interviews with Grade 10 students have begun. We will discuss course selection for next year as well as future aspirations after high school.

Grade 11 Students: I have had the opportunity to talk with every Grade 11 student regarding their career goals after high school. Based on this discussion, we mapped out a rough schedule for their Grade 12 year.

Grade 12 Parents: The grade 12 students who have committed to post-secondary school should apply for RUTHERFORD SCHOLARSHIP late Spring or Summer. There are no set deadlines anymore. Please note that IF your teenager takes a "year off" and THEN attends post-secondary, he/she will still qualify depending on marks. They will apply when they decide to return to school, not now. "Rutherford scholarship" is available to any Alberta student who has 75% and over in 5 subjects (including options) in grades 10, 11, and 12. THEY MUST BE ATTENDING A POST-SECONDARY school TO GET THE MONEY. Even if your teenager says "I don't have good enough marks," he or she should still apply as even work experience marks are included!! The form can be found in the Scholarships area of the ALIS website. (or google "Rutherford Scholarship application") Our school code is "5103" and it takes about 10 minutes to complete online but if you have any questions, please contact me.

April 14th - **CST Foundation Bursary Awards** - 50 awards at \$6,000 each - Applicants must be a Canadian citizen, have graduated high school, and be a first generation post-secondary student (first person in their family to attend college or university)

April 15th - **Mission Creek Orthodontic Scholarship** - \$500 - Submit an answer to the essay question and must be in last year of high school or year 1-3 of your post-secondary degree. *April 28th* - **Ayn Rand Institute (ARI) Essay Contest** - up to \$5,000 - Submit an essay based on one of the novels by Ayn Rand

April 30th - **Northern Alberta Development Council (NADC) Bursary** - up to \$12,000 over 2 years - Must be within two years of completing their program. Recipients are required to sign a contract committing them to work in northern Alberta for each year of receiving the bursary. April 30th - **Paramedic "Pay It Forward" Student Award** - \$1,000 - Nominate student who is studying a paramedic program in Alberta.

April 30th - **Canadian Society of Petroleum Geologists Undergraduate Student Scholarships** - \$1,000 - To provide recognition to up and coming Geology or Earth Science students who demonstrate a keen interest and flair for geology, particularly as it pertains to soft-rock geology and oil and gas exploration and development.

April 30th - **Childhood Cancer Canada Survivor Scholarships** - \$1,500 up to \$5,000 - Open to young adult cancer survivors to support post-secondary academic aspirations and recognize the personal triumphs of students who have survived childhood cancer.

April 30th - **CABEF Canadian Agri-Business Education Foundation Scholarship** - \$3,750 (multiple) - Canadian students who will be pursuing an agricultural or ag-related program at a recognized Canadian college, university or trade school are eligible to apply.

April 30th - **MyBluePrint & ScotiaBank Scholarships**- \$2,500 (7 awards) - There are 4 award categories for students in the Alberta region, including Diversity, STEM, Future Women Leaders and Financial Wellness.

May 1st - Chinook's Edge Exceptional Accomplishment Scholarship - \$100 - For students with Special Needs.

May 1st - **4-H Alberta Scholarships** - Various amounts and criteria - applications are open annually from March to May.

May 1st - **AG for Life & DFC Here for Tomorrow Scholarship** - 3 awards of \$5,000 - for students who submit a creative piece (essay, video, art, etc) about sustainability in the agriculture sector.

Hello Band Parents,






