They can receive the scholarship money if 5 of their subjects average 75%. Local scholarships will open up soon, students should be asking about reference letters!

Message from School Council

Get Involved

The role of School Council is to inform parents, school staff, students and community members so we can work together to enhance the student experience. School Council offers advisory input to school administration.

At the December meeting of Council we had a lively discussion reflecting parents' concern with students accessing inappropriate internet sites on their personal devices while at school. Responses that other schools have taken were offered. It was decided to request that administration gather staff experiences and provide written school procedures on this topic via e-mail to School Council attendees a couple weeks prior to the February meeting. In February we will re-visit this topic to consider whether school procedures could usefully be updated.

In December we also received a presentation from administration on PowerSchool. We were reminded of how excellent a tool it is becoming in providing a window for parents into their student's progress and how they might be more engaged.

In January School Council will receive a presentation from local educator Elizabeth Surridge. Elizabeth has been involved in regular school settings as well as a coordinator in the home school environment. She is currently working with two independent Calgary schools that are based on self-directed learning and it is this that Elizabeth will discuss.
