GRADE 12 PARENTS: Please remember that Rutherford applications must be completed online in July for scholarship money. This is money given ONLY to those who are accepted at a college or university (Trade course as well). They only apply once they are accepted. IF they take a year or three off, they apply at that point.

HIGH SCHOOL PARENTS & STUDENTS: Not all high school options may be used for post-secondary entrance. It is getting very competitive for college, and for university entrance, often the students' option will bring up the average of the 5 required courses.



What a fantastic Book Fair!! We sold \$5000.00 in which 60% stays in our School. Thanks to all the parents and students who support this great fundraiser!!



Message from School Council



We met virtually again in May and decided that this would be our last meeting for the school year. We were able to hear some updates from Mrs. Harvey and Mr. Korody about the process of allocating resources to Cremona School. They explained the formula and decision making structure that is used division wide. This process is used to decide the number of teachers and educational assistants that schools will be allotted based on the specific population and needs of each school. It was very helpful to see the big picture of resource allocation as well as how this impacts decisions on class size and support for the individual classrooms at our school.

They also shared with us the results of the parent survey:

- 25% of parents responded to online surveys

Areas to improve according to results:
