September was a fast paced month with lots of excitement in and around the school. We have also welcomed the variety of weather and have taken the opportunity to get outside and enjoy the fall. Our annual Terry Fox Run was held on September 19 with all the students having an opportunity to reconnect with their house color teams. Thanks to all those that donated to our fundraiser and to those that volunteered that day.

September was also a time to celebrate the previous year's academic success. Our academic awards were well attended and gave us an opportunity to welcome back some past graduates. A total of \$16,000 was awarded that night with an impressive \$7500 coming from local contributors. Our school sports are in full swing. Our cross-country teams have made a great start to our year. They have participated in training and competitions around the area. The students are learning and working on skills at their weekly practices and challenging other teams around the zone and beyond. - October weather can be unpredictable at times, so please be prepared for the changing elements. We at Cremona like our recess time and enjoy it more when dressed appropriately.

- Please communicate absences to the school by calling the office. Also, a quick message to the teacher helps keep everyone in the loop.
- Please let your bus driver know if there is a change in your child being on or off the bus during a school day.
- For 5-12 students, look for updates to your child(s) progress on PowerSchool.
- October has Fire Safety week. This is an opportunity to collaborate with our local fire department to deliver important content on keeping everyone safe.
- Lastly, having indoor shoes can help keep our school cleaner and the floors safer.

Chinook's Edge adopts new safety program

While schools are considered to be one of the safest places in our communities, in reality emergencies can occur anywhere, at any time. Chinook's Edge takes seriously the responsibility to maintain readiness to respond to emergencies, and prioritize student and staff safety in our buildings.

Starting in September 2024, Chinook's Edge has adopted the use of Hour-Zero, which is a school emergency program, used by agencies throughout North America.

While we have always had safety plans in place, through Hour-Zero we have access to the same language used by emergency responders in our community. Also, Hour-Zero's ongoing staff training and support are valuable tools for us.

Each school has an on-site emergency response team, which is supported by the division emergency response team. Staff is trained on emergency protocols with drills being practiced at each school to ensure students and staff are prepared to act quickly and to minimize confusion and fear in a real emergency.

We invite you to take a moment to review this guide for parents / guardians, which outlines protocols and language we will use in emergency situations, as well as how we will communicate with you. Also, on the Chinook's Edge website here, there is a video summary of what you can expect.

For Grade 12 students interested in attending post-secondary next fall, applications open in October. If you are interested in applying for a college program, please be diligent in your applications as some programs are first apply, first admitted, meaning the earlier you apply, the more likely you will be accepted. As for students interested in the University route, it is less urgent as acceptance is based on academic performance.

Post-Secondaries all around the province are running open houses in October. These are a great way to tour the campuses and get more information about specific programs. Open houses are also a great idea because some institutions will waive any application fees if you apply to a program at an open house. If you are interested in attending an open house, you will have to go onto the respective post-secondaries websites to register for the events. You will see Cross country and Volleyball fees in Students Quick pay accounts. Athletics receives no funding so all fees must be covered by the athletes. Volleyball Fees are determined by: Tournament costs; Referee costs; minor official costs (scorekeepers); there is a uniform fee of \$30 per athlete which goes into uniform replacement; and there is a \$200 coach compensation(which the coach can use to cover hotel, travel costs, fuel). The total cost for the team is then divided by the number of players. If you have further questions about fees please contact the school.

Chinook's Edge School Division transportation policy has required that if a driver is transporting students to, or from a school event, the driver must have \$2 million dollar insurance coverage, We also require that the school has a copy of your insurance and driver's license on file prior to transporting students. Students can transport themselves but can not transport other students.


