October was a busy month in the world of Career Exploration at Cremona School. CALM students received presentations from the U of L, RDP and MRU. I hope everyone had a chance to check out some of the post-secondary Open Houses that were taking place all over the province in October. For future Grade 12s, please note that we keep a list of all the open houses on the Cremona School website.

## Dual Credit

Our Olds College Dual Credit students are in full swing. This year we have 5 students in the upper level welding course and 8 students taking the introductory welding course. We also have 7 very dedicated students taking Online Dual Credit programs through Olds College and RDP

## Grade 9

The Grade 9 students have established what type of learning style suits them best and created beautiful posters outlining study tips that correspond with their learning style. They are currently completing interest / skill surveys that will match them with potential career choices. They will then choose a career that interests them and create a presentation about that career.

## Grade 12

We have all had our first 1 on 1 interviews outlining graduation requirements and future aspirations. During these interviews I gave each of your children a post-secondary handbook and or a trades handbook, which outlines the process on how to apply to a post-secondary institution. I also provided each student with a scholarship handbook which outlines how to write a personal essay and lists copious amounts of available scholarships. **Please push your kids to apply to as many scholarships as possible.** Free money is always a great thing!!

In November, we will be conducting our second round of 1 on 1 interviews. The hope is that **EVERY Grade 12 student has a concrete plan for next year**, whether that be post-secondary, seeking employment right away or traveling the world.

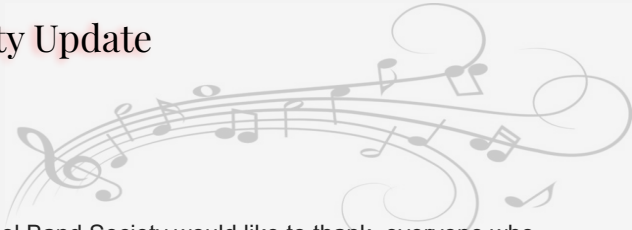

We celebrated Take Me Outside Day on the nature trail!

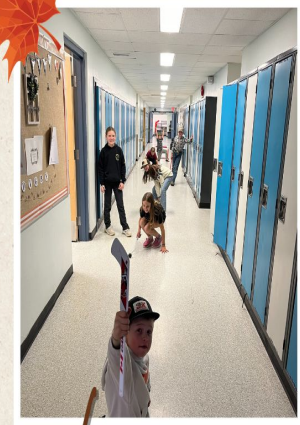
